Public Sector

Remote working and working hours



Maintain remote working and shift work based on the needs of each agency



The employee arrival time will be split in three time zones (7, 8 or 9 a.m.) with a corresponding departure time



- Each agency is responsible of the equal distribution of staff across the three zones
- Employees who are working in shifts are excluded



Permits and citizen services



The special purpose permits will continue depending on the whether schools, kindergartens and nurseries will gradually open, based on the decision of Ministry of Interior



The way public sector serves its citizens will not change. Where digital services are not available, citizen services will continue exclusively through appointments and for emergency reasons only.



Increase the level of services for the citizens that can be carried out via the internet (e-gov) and on-line appointments



Municipalities



'KAPI' will remain closed and their reopening will be determined based on the pandemic progress



Municipal kindergartens and nurseries, as well as 'KDAP' and 'KDAP-MEA' will remain closed and their reopening will be determined based on the pandemic progress



Outdoor sport facilities will open. Indoor sport facilities and gyms will remain closed, and their reopening will be determined based on the pandemic progress and in consultation with the Ministry of Culture and Sports
